



Cliff Walk



Use our Monet Inspired 'Cliff Walk' mini skein set to knit this cowl, and keep the sea breeze at bay.

One Size

Width: 58 cm (23 in)

Depth: 27 cm (10½ in)

Yarn

Ainsworth & Prin Monet Classic Sock mini skeins (4ply weight; 80% Superwash Merino wool, 20% Nylon; Total approx. 100g/365m (5x20g/73m)

Colour shown Cliff Walk

Needles and Accessories

2.75mm / US 2 circular needles 40cm / 16in long.

3.25mm / US 3 circular needles 40cm / 16in long.

1 stitch marker.

Tapestry needle for cast off and weaving in ends.

Cliff Walk Cowl

PATTERN NOTES

The cowl is worked in a 4 round pattern. Rounds 1 and 2 are worked in one colour and rounds 3 and 4 are worked in a contrast colour. These change throughout the piece. Carry the alternating colours up the inside of the work.

Sewn Cast-Off

To maintain a loose edge the cowl is finished with a sewn cast off.

Cut your yarn leaving a very long tail, about four times the circumference of the finished piece for safety. Thread onto the tapestry needle.

*Thread the tapestry needle purlwise through the first two stitches on the left hand needle, but don't drop the stitches off the needle. Then thread the needle knitwise through the first stitch and drop this stitch off the needle. Repeat from * with the remaining stitches.

TENSION

27sts and 45 rounds to 10cm worked over pattern using 3.25mm /US 3 needles, measured after blocking.

You may need smaller or larger needles to match tension.

ABBREVIATIONS

* repeat as described

k: knit

k2tog: knit 2 stitches together (1 st dec'd)

KPK: knit 1, purl 1, knit 1, all into the next stitch (2 sts inc'd)

p: purl

rep: repeat

sl: slip stitch purlwise without knitting it

ssk: slip the next two stitches, knitwise, one at a time, return to the LH needle in their new orientation and k together through back loops. (1 st dec'd)

st/s: stitch/es

wyib: with yarn in back



Yarns used in order

Yarn A = Blue Green

Yarn B = Green

Yarn C = Cream

Yarn D = Buff

Yarn E = Pale Blue Green

Cast On

Using 2.75mm / US 2 needles, yarn A and the long-tail method, cast-on 156 sts.

Round 1: Purl.

Round 2: Knit.

Repeat rounds 1 and 2 once more.

Join in yarn B, do not break yarn A

Change to 3.25mm / US 3 circular needles.

Round 1: With Yarn B. K2, * sl1 wyib, KPK, sl1 wyib, k3; rep from * to last 4 sts, sl1 wyib, KPK, sl1 wyib, k1.

Round 2: With Yarn B. K2, * sl1 wyib, k3; rep from * to last 2 sts, sl1, k1.

Round 3: With Yarn A. * K1, k2tog, k3, ssk; rep from * to end.

Round 4: With Yarn A. * P1, k2; rep from * to end.

Repeat the 4 round pattern 8 times more.

Break Yarn B and join in Yarn C.

Using Yarn C for rounds 1 and 2 and continuing with Yarn A for rounds 3 and 4, work 3 reps of pattern, then work rounds 1 and 2 once more.

Break Yarn A and join in Yarn B.

Round 3: With Yarn B.

Round 4: With Yarn B.

Continuing with Yarn C for rounds 1 and 2 and Yarn B for rounds 3 and 4, work 4 reps of pattern, then work rounds 1 and 2 once more.

Break Yarn B and join in Yarn D.

Round 3: With Yarn D.

Round 4: With Yarn D.

Continuing with Yarn C for rounds 1 and 2 and Yarn D for rounds 3 and 4, work 3 reps of pattern.

Break Yarn C and join in Yarn E.

Using Yarn E for rounds 1 and 2 and continuing with Yarn D for rounds 3 and 4, work 8 reps of pattern, then work rounds 1 to 3 once more.

Change to 2.75mm / US 2 needle.

Next round: Purl.

Next round: Knit.

Next round: Purl.

Using the Sewn Cast-Off, or other stretchy cast-off method, cast off all sts.

Finishing

Weave in all ends.
